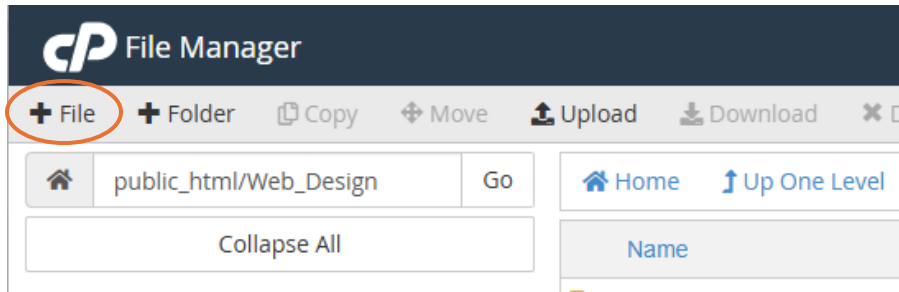


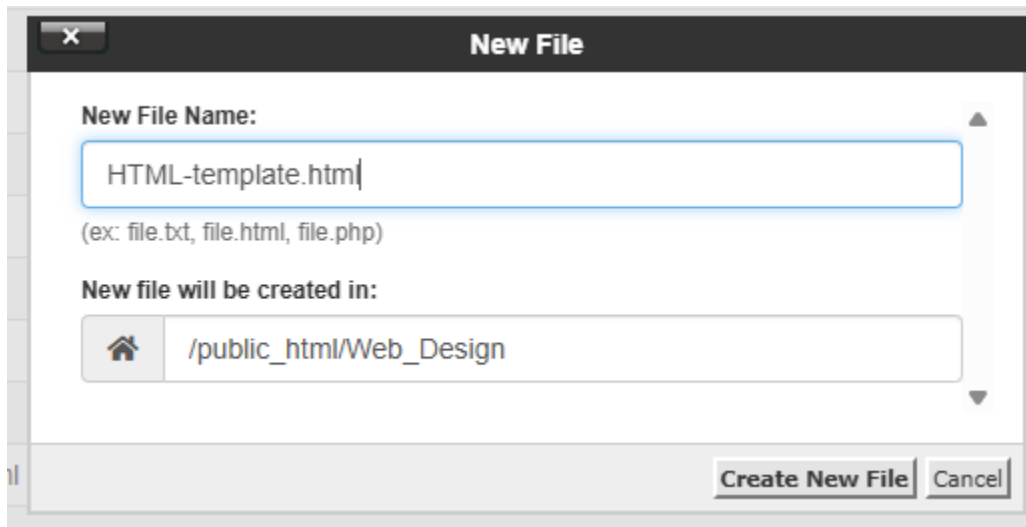
Creating an HTML Template in cPanel

When you make a new HTML page in your cPanel account, it can be helpful to have a starting point, rather than having to start from scratch for each new page. One way to create such a starting point is to make a template. Then, when you make a new page, you can copy and paste the code from your template so that your new page will very quickly have a basic structure in place.

Step 1: Click on + File.



Step 2: Give the template an appropriate name, to remind you that it is a template. Remember to have no spaces in the file name, and to include the .html extension.



Step 3: Edit the template page. Start the HTML and add a head section. You may want to include links to your favicon and to any stylesheet that you might want to use on any given page. You may also want to consider including a style tag that includes a background color or image, just to get things started.

Step 4: Include a body section. You might want to add some basic text, or you might leave the body section empty for now.
